



STUDENT HEALTH AND RISK PREVENTION SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

Nebraska Risk and Protective Factor Student Survey (NRPFSS)

- A survey of all students in public and non-public schools in grades 8, 10, and 12
- Data generates reports at the state, county, school district, local health department, regional behavioral health authority and coalition-levels
- Collects information related to substance use, delinquent behaviors, bullying, and risk and protective measures that predispose youth toward or protect them against problem behaviors • Local and regional estimates are generated for health planning and evaluation
- Schools and community coalitions are provided the information that is necessary for accessing federal funds

Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS)

- A survey of students in public schools in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12
 - Schools and classrooms are randomly selected by the CDC
- Data generates a state-level report
- Collects information to identify and monitor priority health risk behaviors that are established during youth and result in sickness, disability, death, and social problems among youth and adults (including unintentional injuries and violence, mental health and suicide, tobacco, alcohol and drug use, sexual risk behaviors, unhealthy dietary behaviors, and physical inactivity)
- The only survey in Nebraska that provides state level estimates for high school students across a variety of important health measures
- Data are used to plan, evaluate, and improve school and community prevention and intervention programs

Youth Tobacco Survey (YTS)

- A survey of students in public schools in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12
 - Schools and classrooms are randomly selected by the CDC
- Data generates a state-level report
- Collects detailed information regarding the quantity and frequency of tobacco use (including cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, electronic cigarettes, etc.)
- Data helps state and communities plan effective youth tobacco prevention initiatives
- Provides tobacco-related information not capture through YRBS and NRPFSS
