Meat Judging’s 100-year Contribution to Meat Industry Workforce Development

This research is in partnership with the American Meat Science Association (AMSA) to investigate the impact the Intercollegiate Meat Judging program has had on meat industry workforce development in addition to understanding why the program has continued for nearly a century (100 years in 2026).

Ohio Beef Quality Audit (OBQA) 2021 – Survey of Carcass Characteristics Related to Quality Attributes and the Investigation of Meat Processor Needs

The Ohio Beef Quality Audit (OBQA) – 2021 served as the first ever statewide/level beef quality audit. Research goals included capturing the status of the beef industry in the state of Ohio while simultaneously investigating the viewpoints and needs of Ohio’s beef processors.

Primary Investigator

- Visited and collected data at 15 small-medium-scale beef packing facilities. Conducted interviews with meat processing facility owners/managers and collected beef quality characteristic data on all available beef carcasses.
- Journal manuscript submitted to the Journal of Extension. Publication proceeding approval.

Ohio’s County Fairs Beef Carcass Shows (2016 – 2021): Survey of Beef Carcass Characteristics Related to Quality Attributes

This research project aimed to showcase the quality of beef produced from county fair beef carcass contest entries and provide insight into the role youth play in the state’s beef/meat industry.
