Course Descriptions/updates

Principles of Horse Evaluation and Judging (ASCI 300E): The basics of evaluating horses for conformation and performance are introduced. Every effort is made to incorporate live classes; however, videotapes are used extensively to allow students to evaluate a wide range of events. The most current industry trends and issues are presented. (1992 – 2005, 2011 - Present). Added Experiential Learning designation – 2023.

Advanced Horse Evaluation and Judging (ASCI 400E): This course makes up the UNL Horse Judging Team that competes at two national intercollegiate contests each fall. From fall 2000-2002, this course was taught on an even year basis, beginning in 2003, it is taught annually again, with instructors rotating. (1991 – 2005, 2010 - present). Added Experiential Learning designation – 2023.

Horse Industry Study Tour (ASCI 311A): Study tour of the equine industry to provide an understanding of the industry's operations and current trends. A combination of breeding, training, associations, veterinary facilities, etc., will be toured. (2006 – Present). Added Experiential Learning designation – 2023.

Study Tours in International Agriculture (AGRI 310): A short-term, international, group study of the horse industry and industry education (aka extension) in Ireland. Emphasis also on learning about the history and culture of this amazing country.

Applied Horse Skills AASCI 399): This is a hands-on short course to develop horse management skills routinely practiced in the equine industry uses. The course is taught for 3 days during the winter intersession.

Basic Equitation (ASCI 260): This course is designed to primarily work on improving an individual's riding skills. All students ride English and Western throughout the semester and are videotaped three times during the semester for evaluation of the students' progress by both the instructors and students. Graduate and undergraduate teaching assistants are used to allow for one-on-one instruction which is essential to meet the needs of the diverse skill levels of students enrolled in the course. (1992 – 2005)

Advanced Equitation (ASCI 360): The primary focus of this course is to develop a greater appreciation of horse training methods. Mature horses are used as models to teach training techniques that are later applied to young "training" horses. Students also complete a trainer philosophy project where they interview a horse trainer of their choice and give an oral presentation and written paper to the class. (1991 – 2005)

Horse Management (ASCI 450): Several areas of horse production and management are covered in this course including conformation, health care, reproduction, nutrition, facilities, etc. This is primarily a lecture course; however, several "hands-on" laboratories have been added, including semen collection and evaluation, body condition scoring, use of weight tapes, and vulva conformation evaluation, exercise physiology, evaluating a nutritional program, health care practices, hoof care, and lameness evaluation. (1992 – Present)

Equine Nutrition (ASCI 322): This is an in depth study of nutrition of the horse including both basic digestive physiology plus up-to-date information on nutritional management for all classes of horses. The course is taught by both lecture and group projects. (2003 – Present, odd years). Developed to on-line section for Spring 2012.

Equine Reproduction (ASCI 342): This course provides students with a focused study of reproduction, specific to the horse. Estrous detection systems, artificial and natural breeding techniques, infertility, semen collection and processing, reproductive management and record keeping are covered. (2006 – Present, even years) Developed to on-line section for Summer, 2013.

Horse Management Practicum (ASCI 399): A "hands-on" course to develop horse management skills routinely practiced in the equine industry. This will be a once-a-week laboratory course. Most class periods will be conducted at local facilities or by industry professionals. (2006 – 2009)
