

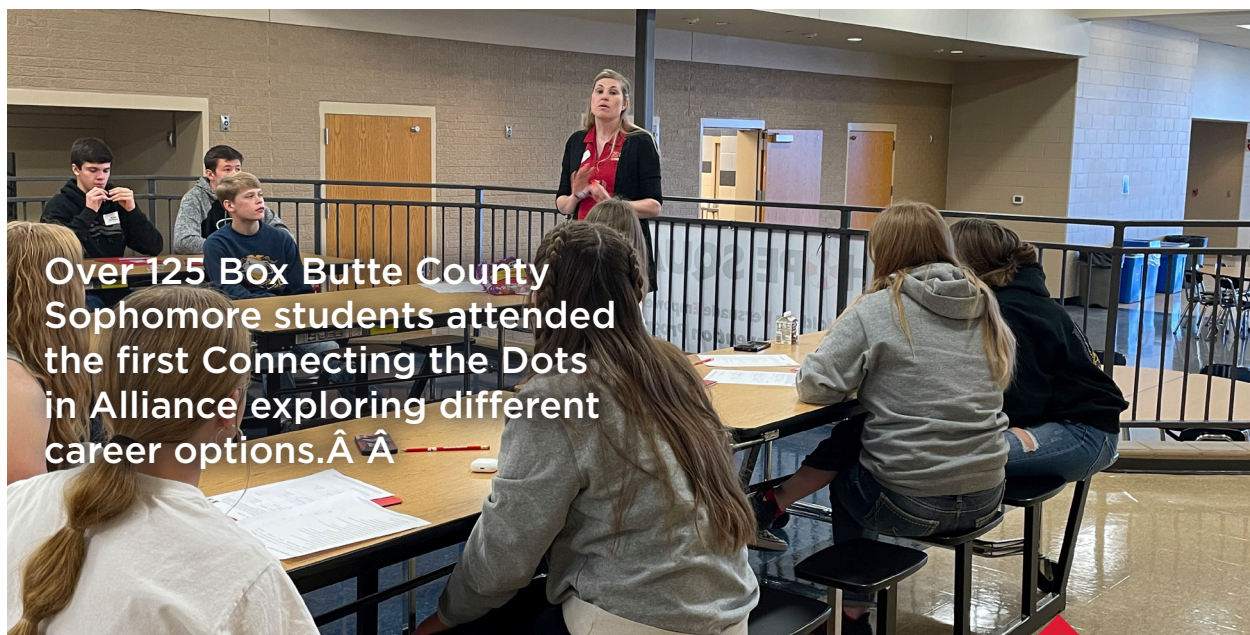

2022 Impact At-A-Glance



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Over 125 Box Butte County Sophomore students attended the first Connecting the Dots in Alliance exploring different career options.Â Â

Students found skills that motivate them, practiced interview skills, learned about resume building and connected with over 20 community volunteers while exploring a variety of careers through the Connecting the Dots simulation. One student commented, "You and Lori helped me learn so much about my future career path! I cannot thank you enough for supporting my understanding of my future career!" From the program 94% said this program helped them at least a little bit in their decisions about college. 98% of participants reported that this program helped them explore future career options.

Programs At-A-Glance

- Agspllosion: 121 2nd grade youth participated in the Agspllosion festival. After attending the festivalÂ 99% of the students said they learned something new.
- Leadership Summit: A 5th grade participant wrote: 'œWhat you brought to my life is happiness. I never felt this way in a long time, I made lots of new friends because of you guys.'
