#### Delve into Nebraska's Heartland...

....visit a pumpkin patch where Brett Nunnenkamp started raising pumpkins at age 13. Today, *The Country Pumpkin* offers over 50 varieties of pumpkins, squash, gourds, and ornamental corn including many heirloom types. Brent invites you to tour their farm and maybe pick a pumpkin, squash, or gourd (or 2, or 3, or 4).

....visit *MARC* where researchers develop scientific information and new technology to solve high priority problems of national concern for the U.S. beef, sheep, and swine industries. Multidisciplinary teams emphasize both short- and long-term solutions to improve animal production and product quality. The program includes research on genetics and breeding, reproduction, nutrition, meats science, production systems, biological engineering, and animal health. Research Scientists will describe a couple

of projects and guide a bus tour among the beef, sheep and swine.

Designed and appliqued by Gay Gallup and handstitched by Gay and members of




the Piecemakers Interest Group, the quilt will be on display with opportunities to buy raffle tickets at UNLWC events held throughout the year.
