Tour a Grand Old Building: Fremont Opera House

The Fremont Opera House, formerly the Love Opera House held its grand opening performance December 14, 1888. It was the start to nearly 28 years of successful live theater in Fremont.



This five-story structure was considered one of the finest buildings in the state, with an amazing seating capacity of 1,100. The theater space located on the upper three floors was considered ornate with an impressive domed ceiling.

In 1975 the Opera House became the first building in Fremont to join the National Registry of Historic Places. It earned this recognition in part due to the architecture of the structure and physical size.
