Fall Tour Wednesday, October 11

A special day touring the Homestead National Monument and visiting spots of interest in Beatrice, including lunch, has been planned for your enjoyment.

We will meet at 7:45 a.m. at Christ Place Church, 1111 Old Cheney, and carpool to Homestead National Monument located four miles west of Beatrice. Following rolls and beverage from Sunrise Bakery, we will be treated to a private tour and presentation by Historian

Jonathan Fairchild entitled "Planted in the Soil: The Homestead Act, Women Homesteaders, and the 19th Amendment." This program gives a focused look on hundreds of thousands of women who joined a historically enfranchised class of landowners and used their newfound economic power to push for equality in the eyes of the law. We will learn how women homesteaders helped lead the way to the



passage of the Nineteenth Amendment in 1920.

Following our tour, we will travel to Beatrice, stop at Grandma's Fruitcakes, and then enjoy lunch at the Black Crow. Following the meal, we will visit Yesterday's Lady and Cedar Creek Pottery before returning to Lincoln at 4:00.

Locations are easily accessible on the first floor of all buildings. Some walking is required (2-3 blocks). Parking is available near all locations.

Cost of the Fall Tour is \$38. Refunds will not be available for tour cancellations.

UNLWC Represented at Big 10 University Club Conference

Marilynn Schnepf and Karen Buckley, president and past president, represented UNLWC at the Big 10 University Club Conference, held June 11-13 at Michigan State University.

Karen is pictured with the featured speaker, Mona Hanna-Attisha, author of "What the Eyes Don't See; A Story of Crisis, Resistance, and Hope in an American City." Dr. Hanna-Attisha, alongside a team of researchers, parents, friends and community members, discovered the children of Flint, MI were being exposed to lead in their tap water. Her book is part part expose and memoir and becomes a story of hope as Flint citizens have forged a new path to a better world for their children.



Other activities included a campus tour, luncheon at the Cowles House, official residence of the MSU president, and opportunities to network with other Big-10 university clubs. Twelve of the fourteen Big-10 Universities participated in the conference. The two newest members, Maryland and Rutgers, did not send representatives. The next Big-10 conference will be in Iowa City in 2025; Nebraska will host the conference in 2029.

The generosity of UNL Women's Club members and friends remained steadfast, continuing to fulfill our mission to students at UNL through fundraising efforts and direct donations.

During the 2022-2023 fiscal year, approximately 110 individuals donated a total of \$12,385, which included a \$1,400 donation from UNLWC as a result of their overall budget savings

The annual basket raffle was held again at the Spring Luncheon. There were 16 unique baskets provided by the interest groups and some individuals. The raffle brought in \$981. The Piecemakers interest group donated a beautiful handmade quilted wall hanging which made \$370 in raffle ticket sales. The total from the baskets and quilt raffle was \$1,351 which all went to our scholarship fund.

The grand total for 2022-23 year was \$13,736. These fundraising efforts are evidence that our tradition remains strong and that our membership is steadfast in their support of UNL and the students who make academic excellence a priority.
